**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

This matter arises under the Federal-State Unemployment Compensation Act of 1970 (Pub. L. 91-373). Employment and Training Order No. 5-85 codifies the administrative procedures applicable to the hearing of this case. The order provides that the procedures outlined at 29 C.F.R. Part 18 are applicable and that the decision of the Administrative Law Judge constitutes the final action by the Secretary of Labor unless exceptions are filed.

On May 10, 1995, the parties submitted a Stipulation of Dismissal, a copy of which is appended hereto and made a part of this Order. The parties represent that all issues have been settled and they request dismissal of this case with prejudice pursuant to 29 C.F.R. § 18.9(c)(2). Each party has agreed to bear its own fees and expenses, including attorneys' fees and litigation costs.

In view of the above, IT IS ORDERED that this case is hereby dismissed with full prejudice.
