O R D E R:

On January 21, 2004, the Clerk's office notified Appellant, through his attorney, Edward Slavin, that the transcript order form in Appeal No. 03-15112 was overdue and that the appeal would be

dismissed in fourteen days unless the default was corrected.

On February 2, 2004, Mr. Slavin submitted on Appellant's behalf a "Motion for Consolidation and Motion for Enlargement of Time," seeking to consolidate these appeals and asking for an extension of time to file the transcript order form in Appeal No. 03-15112. However, at the time he submitted this motion, Mr. Slavin's application for admission to the Eleventh Circuit bar was incomplete. Accordingly, he was not eligible to represent Appellant before this Court. See 11th Cir. R. 11th Cir. R. 46-1(a). In addition, the "Motion for Consolidation and Motion for Enlargement of Time" lacked the Certificate of Interested Persons and Corporate Disclosure Statement required by 11th Cir. R. 26.1-1 and 26.1-2.

By letter dated February 3, 2004, the Clerk's office asked Mr. Slavin to provide the necessary additional information for his bar application. By letter dated February 13, 2004, Mr. Slavin was informed that, unless he provided the additional information and the Certificate of Interested Persons and Corporate Disclosure Statement within fourteen (14) days, Appeal No. 03-15112 would be clerically dismissed for want of prosecution.

Instead of meeting the February 27, 2004, deadline for compliance, on March 1, 2004, Mr. Slavin submitted a motion on Appellant's behalf to enlarge the time to comply with this Court's

rules and the instructions previously given. As he has not been admitted to this Court's bar, Mr. Slavin remains ineligible to represent Appellant. In addition, the most recent motion lacks the requisite Certificate of Interested Persons and Corporate Disclosure Statement. Accordingly, the Clerk is directed to return unfiled the February 2 and March 1 motions. The Clerk is further directed to DISMISS Appeal No. 03-15112 for want of prosecution.
