**ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO DISMISS WITH PREJUDICE
AND CANCELLING HEARING**

On July 15, 2011, Complainant filed a complaint with the Secretary of Labor alleging that Flexjet unjustly discharged him in retaliation for complaining to management about pilot rest time violations in contravention of the Wendell H. Ford Aviation Investment and Reform Act for the 21st Century (“AIR21”), 49 U.S.C. § 42121.

On April 27, 2012, Complainant on behalf of both parties filed a Joint Motion to Dismiss. Therein, the parties agreed that any and all claims and causes of action brought by Complainant against Respondent in this matter are withdrawn and should be dismissed with prejudice; and, each party should bear its own expenses, costs, and attorneys’ fees associated with this Action.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the parties’ joint motion to dismiss with prejudice is GRANTED and each party shall bear its own expenses, costs, and attorneys’ fees.

IT IS FURTHER HEREBY ORDERED that the hearing scheduled to begin on July 17, 2012, in Dallas, Texas, is CANCELLED.
