DECISION AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On December 8, 2020, I issued an Order to Show Cause Why Matter Should Not Be Dismissed for Want of Prosecution and Order Granting Motion to Withdraw (the "OSC"). The OSC was served by regular mail on both addresses we have for Complainant. A review of the Office of Administrative Law Judges' Case Tracking System ("CTS") does not indicate that either copy of the OSC was returned by the U.S. Post Office as undeliverable.

The OSC stated,

Complainant is thus ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE, within 14 days of the date of this order, why this matter should not be dismissed. At a minimum, Complainant should provide an explanation why he has failed to actively prosecute his claim against Respondent. If Complainant does not submit a timely response to this order to show cause, or responds but fails to provide an adequate explanation as to why he has not actively prosecuted his claim against Respondent, this matter will be dismissed.

OSC at 1-2.

As of January 28, 2021, a review of CTS indicates that Complainant did not submit a response to the OSC. Accordingly, this matter is **DISMISSED**.
