**DECISION AND ORDER**  
**APPROVING CONSENT DECREE AND ORDER**

This case arises under Executive Order 11246 (30 Fed. Reg. 12319), as amended by Executive Order 11375 (32 Fed. Reg. 14303), Executive Order 12086 (43 Fed. Reg. 46501), and the rules and regulations pursuant thereto. Jurisdiction over this action exists under Sections 208 and 209 of Executive Order 11246, 41 C.F.R. § 60-1.26, and 41 C.F.R. Part 60-30.

On September 5, 2012, the parties filed a document with this Office, entitled "Consent Decree and Order," executed by counsel for Plaintiff and Defendant and a representative of Defendant. A review of the Consent Decree and Order shows that it is in compliance with 41 C.F.R. § 60-30.13(d), and that it fairly and adequately resolves all disputed issues between the parties.

Accordingly, the Consent Decree, attached hereto and incorporated herein, is **APPROVED** and **ADOPTED** in its entirety. The parties will comply with its terms. As the parties requested, this Office will retain jurisdiction for two years from the date of the Order to consider any disputes concerning compliance with the Order and to issue additional orders as required in furtherance of this Order. If, at the end of the two-year

period, Defendant is in compliance with this Order, the case will be closed and jurisdiction terminated. If Defendant is not in compliance, this Office will retain jurisdiction until such time as Defendant comes into compliance, at which time the case will be closed and jurisdiction terminated.
