**ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO ALTER PRE-HEARING DEADLINES  
AND EXTEND PAGE LIMIT FOR DISPOSITIVE MOTIONS**

This matter arises under Executive Order 11246 (30 Fed. Reg. 12319), as amended, (“EO 11246”) and associated regulations at 41 C.F.R. Chapter 60. Hearing is set to begin on December 5, 2019. On August 7, 2019, the parties filed a stipulation and request to adjust some of the pre-hearing deadlines and extend the page limits for dispositive motions.

Presently, expert discovery ends on August 30, 2019, and any *Daubert* or dispositive motions must be filed by September 20, 2019. Oppositions are due on October 11, 2019, with replies due on October 21, 2019. The parties have agreed to adjust the first two dates such that expert discovery would close on September 13, 2019, and any *Daubert* or dispositive motions would be due on September 25, 2019. The deadlines for oppositions and replies remain the same. The parties have also agreed to alter the page limits for dispositive motions. Currently all motions and oppositions are limited to 20 pages and any reply brief is limited to 10 pages. The parties seek to extend this limit for dispositive motions such that motions and oppositions are limited to 30 pages and replies are limited to 15 pages.

Given the parties' agreement in this matter, their motion to alter the pre-hearing deadlines and extend the page limits for briefing dispositive motions is granted. The pre-hearing schedule is modified as stated above. All other dates remain unchanged. Briefs on dispositive motions are limited to 30 pages with reply briefs limited to 15 pages. The prior page limits otherwise remain in effect.
