ORDER SETTING EXPEDITED BRIEFING SCHEDULE FOR PENDING MOTION

This matter arises under Executive Order 11246 (30 Fed. Reg. 12319), as amended, (“EO 11246”) and associated regulations at 41 C.F.R. Chapter 60. It has been pending since January 17, 2017. Hearing is set to begin on December 5, 2019. Outside of a lengthy stay, this case has been marked by repeated and voluminous discovery disputes, resulting in multiple, sometimes lengthy orders. In the late afternoon of Friday, October 11, 2019, Oracle filed a Motion for Protective Order Preventing OFCCP from Introducing or Relying on Untimely Expert Analyses, or, in the Alternative, Motion to Strike.

Along with its motion, Oracle seeks an expedited briefing schedule so that the disputes can be resolved prior to the due date for dispositive and *Daubert* motions, October 21, 2019. I make no comment on the merits of Oracle’s underlying motion, but I agree that it is proper to decide the issues raised on an expedited briefing schedule. Accordingly, OFCCP must file any opposition to Oracle’s motion by noon Pacific time on Thursday, October 17, 2019. No reply brief is permitted.
