ORDER OF REMAND

On December 27, 2018, CLW Family, LLP, (the “Employer”) filed a request for de novo hearing in the above-captioned temporary alien labor certification matter. The above-captioned case is scheduled for a telephonic hearing on February 5, 2019. On January 31, 2019, via facsimile, Esperanza N. Sanchez, submitted the Certifying Officer’s Motion for Remand¹. She stated that the certifying officer and attorney for the employer have reached an agreement and have determined that the Employer’s H-2A application for temporary labor certification should be remanded to the agency for additional processing. Employer’s representative, Mr. Wendel Hall, was contacted on January 31, 2019 and had no objection to granting this motion.

WHEREFORE, the above considered, this case is remanded to the agency for further processing of the employer’s H-2A application. The telephone hearing scheduled for February 5, 2019 is hereby cancelled.
