**ORDER OF REMAND**

This case involves the labor certification for temporary and seasonal agricultural employment of nonimmigrant foreign workers (H-2A workers) under the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), as amended, 8 USC 1101, et seq., and its implementing regulations at 20 CFR Part 655, Subpart B. This matter has been referred for decision and assigned to the undersigned.

On July 17, 2020, Counsel for the Solicitor filed “Certifying Officer’s Motion for Remand” regarding 2020 TLC 95. He stated, “The Certifying Officer and the Employer have reached an agreement in the above-referenced case and have determined that the Employer’s application for H-2A temporary labor certification should be remanded to the Agency for additional processing.” Solicitor stated that, “The Employer consents to the granting of this motion.”

In view of all the foregoing, **this case is hereby REMANDED to the Certifying Officer pursuant to 20 CFR §655.171 for action pursuant to 20 CFR Part 655, Subpart B.**
