ORDER REMANDING CASE

On September 3, 2020, the above-captioned Employer requested a *de novo* hearing on the Certifying Officer's decision in the above captioned H-2A temporary labor certification matter. *See* 8 U.S.C. §§ 1101(a)(15)(H)(ii)(a), 1188; 20 C.F.R. § 655.171(b). This case was assigned to me and was scheduled for a hearing on September 29, 2020, via the Microsoft Teams video conferencing platform.

However, on September 23, 2020, counsel for the Certifying Officer filed an Unopposed Motion to Remand for Further Processing ("Motion"), requesting that I cancel the formal hearing
