**ORDER OF REMAND**

On November 23, 2011, Williams Forestry (“the Employer”) filed a request for review in the above-captioned temporary alien labor certification matter. On December 8, 2011, BALCA received a request for remand from counsel for the Certifying Officer (“CO”) in order to grant certification. Counsel for the CO stated that she spoke to counsel for the Employer, who advised that he objected to the request for remand.

On December 8, 2011, the Employer requested that this appeal be remanded and the Employer's application be certified within 24 hours. The Employer explained that it has a time-sensitive and weather-dependent need for the work to be performed as soon as possible. While I decline to instruct the CO to issue certification within 24 hours, I recognize that the Employer does have a time-sensitive need for the work to be performed. Accordingly, I urge the CO to grant certification as soon as practicable.

In light of the foregoing, it is hereby **ORDERED** that this matter is **REMANDED** for certification.
