**ORDER GRANTING JOINT STIPULATION OF DISMISSAL
WITH PREJUDICE**

This matter arises under the Workforce Investment Act (WIA), 29 U.S.C. § 2801 *et seq.*, and the implementing regulations at 20 C.F.R. Parts 660 through 670.

This matter was received and docketed in the Office of Administrative Law Judges on January 7, 2014 upon receipt of Respondent's request for hearing. On January 30, 2014, I issued a Prehearing Order in which I directed the parties to submit and exchange certain information. The Respondent thereafter filed on behalf of both parties a Joint Request for Extension of Time, and I issued an Order Granting Extension to file Prehearing Exchanges on February 21, 2014, that allowed the parties additional time to review information that could lead to settlement of the issues in this matter. On March 10, 2014, I also issued an Order Granting Extension to file Administrative File filed by the Respondent on the behalf of both parties. This Office subsequently received correspondence from the Complainant on May 7, 2014, advising that the parties have resolved the issues in this matter, and that the Stipulation of Dismissal was being drafted.

On June 3, 2014, Complainant filed a Joint Stipulation for Dismissal with Prejudice signed by the parties. The parties stated therein that the Grant Officer has reviewed the Final Determination against Respondent and issued a Revised Final Determination, dated May 8, 2014, which resolves the issues in this case. The Revised Final Determination

further states that the parties, by their attorneys, respectfully stipulate that this appeal be dismissed with prejudice.

As the issues between the parties have been resolved, and a hearing is no longer necessary, Complainant's motion is GRANTED and this case is DISMISSED.
